#### **SUMMARY**

Otterbourne Parish Council is seeking a release of £28,600 from their Open Space Fund to allow them to enhance the children's play area in Oakwood Park.

The improvement of this play area is an objective of the 2008-09 'Open Space Strategy'.

#### DECISION

That, subject to planning permission being granted, the release of £28,600 from the Open Space Fund to Otterbourne Parish Council be approved.

# REASON FOR THE DECISION AND OTHER ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED

Otterbourne parish is deficient in children's play space. The only equipped play area is at the main Oakwood Park recreation ground. This play area is classified as a 'local equipped area for play' (LEAP) in the Open Space Strategy but it should be refurbished, further extended and enlarged to 'neighbourhood equipped area for play' (NEAP) standard, so as to provide the main central play facility for the parish.

The parish council have consulted over the summer to determine preferred designs which will encompass toddler, junior and disabled users between the ages of 18 months to approximately 11 years.

The proposed plan is for a marginally increased area but in the same footprint as at present. Fencing will be either wooden or metal bow top and the area will include two sets of swings plus a large wooden climbing frame.

Southern Water, who leases the land to the parish council, has confirmed they have no objection to the proposals. The lease dates from February 2006 and runs for 21 years with a renewable option for a further 21 years. The freehold has also been offered to the Parish Council and early negotiations are currently underway.
