PROPOSED INDIVIDUAL DECISION BY THE PORTFOLIO HOLDER FOR COMMUNITIES, CULTURE AND SPORT

TOPIC - SMALL GRANTS: SECOND ROUND 2012/13

PROCEDURAL INFORMATION

The Access to Information Procedure Rules – Part 4, Section 22 of the Council's Constitution provides for a decision to be made by an individual member of Cabinet.

In accordance with the Procedure Rules, the Corporate Director (Governance), the Chief Executive and the Head of Finance are consulted together with Chairman and Vice Chairman of The Overview and Scrutiny Committee and any other relevant overview and scrutiny committee. In addition, all Members are notified.

If five or more Members from those informed so request, the Leader may require the matter to be referred to Cabinet for determination.

SUMMARY

- The <u>Small Grants</u> programme provides funding of up to £500 for charitable, voluntary and not-for-profit organisations in the District;
- The programme is intended to support the purchase of small items of equipment, venue hire, printing or other one-off costs associated with a project or activity;
- A total of £15,000 was allocated for Small Grants in 2012/13 within the overall Council budget, slightly increased on the previous year in order to support requests from groups planning celebrations for the Diamond Jubilee or the Olympic and Paralympic Games;

- A total of 24 applications has been received, nine applications are considered to fall outside the purpose and criteria of the programme as demonstrated elsewhere in this Notice.
- This is the final round for 2012/2013, intended to support activities taking place between November 2012 and March 2013.
- The Council has traditionally sought to provide support for as many of the eligible applications under this programme as possible. Because the total requested exceeds the amount available, it is not possible to award the full amount of grant requested to all applicants.

PROPOSED DECISION

- 1. That the recommended awards to be made to local voluntary organisations from the second round of the Small Grants Programme for 2012/13 be approved, as set out in Appendix 1;
- 2. That the Assistant Director (Economic Prosperity) be authorised, in consultation with the Portfolio Holder, *not* to make the recommended award should officers subsequently determine that there are reasonable grounds not to do so (for example, the expenditure having been made before the grant was offered), and to reallocate any such monies to the emergency grants reserve.

REASON FOR THE **PROPOSED** DECISION AND OTHER ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED

- The recommendations set out at Appendix 1 are made in accordance with the criteria for the Small Grants Programme.
- Organisations are asked to demonstrate where possible that their project or activity is linked to the delivery of one or more of the Winchester District Community Strategy priorities. These are:
 - Promoting the wellbeing of older people;
 - Improving access to services;
 - o reducing the District's carbon footprint;
 - improving the quality of life in the neighbourhoods of Stanmore and Winnall/Highcliffe.
 - The total requested in grants for this second round came to over £10,300, twice the sum available. The amount available is £5,030, so officers applied the following principles in determining the recommended awards set out in Appendix 1:

a) Previous applications

In order to spread the Small Grants scheme as widely as possible, any organisation which received a Small Grant in 2011/12 are not be entitled to a further Small Grant in this round;

and

b) Community Strategy priority weightings

- Although working within the parameters above, the Portfolio Holder has also considered some qualitative aspects of the bids. These include:
 - o value for money (eg consideration of the estimated number of beneficiaries);
 - the level of credibility of the bid in terms of the way it is structured, evidenced and costed;
 - o the distinctiveness and creativity of the project proposed.
- In no instances is it considered that the awarding of a smaller total than requested will prevent the project or activity from taking place, as they are generally 'scale-able' or the difference can be made up through existing fund raising plans or reserve balances.
- Nine applications are recommended for refusal as follows:
 - a) three are for a building work/refurbishment projects which are outside the scope of the Small Grants Programme, and will be redirected to the Active Communities Project Fund for 2013/14 (if available) or other relevant external funding programmes;
 - b) one is for the enhancement of activity which is already core funded;

- c) one is for an activity similar to one funded through an Active Community Project grant in 2011/2012;
- d) four received a Small Grant in 2011/2012.

The Portfolio Holder considers the proposed awards in Appendix 1 to be fair ones, based on the principles above.

RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS:

A total of £15,000 was allocated to the Small Grants Programme as part of the 2012/13 budget (<u>WTF164 January 2012</u> refers). This year's Programme identified two rounds for applications. In May £9,970 was awarded for the first round, leaving £5,030 to be allocated in this second round.

Of this sum, the recommended awards set out in Appendix 1 total £5,150. The recommended total represents an overspend of £120, which will be funded by a virement from the Active Communities commissioning budget for 2012/13.

CONSULTATION UNDERTAKEN ON THE PROPOSED DECISION

The Portfolio Holder for Communities, Culture and Sport has reviewed the Small Grant applications and further input has been invited from relevant officers from within the Council, and from the Corporate Management Team through the drafting of this Decision Notice.

These grants are for a maximum of £500, and officers are increasingly seeking to make the process as time-efficient and streamlined as possible to the benefit of both the voluntary organisations applying and the Council. Consultation is deliberately restricted, with the objective of making rapid decisions based on published criteria and adopted priorities.
