<u>TOPIC - PROPOSED 30MPH SPEED LIMIT EXTENSION - MILL LANE, WICKHAM</u>

SUMMARY

As part of the planning permission for the development of housing on a field to the north of Wickham Community Centre on Mill Lane, money was collected under the terms of the County Council's Transport Contributions Policy for highway improvements to Mill Lane in the vicinity of the site (Section 106 Agreement).

One of the improvements agreed was the extension of the 30mph speed limit which currently terminates a few metres north of the access to the community centre and new development.

It is proposed to extend the 30mph speed limit for a distance of 100 metres to help reduce vehicle speeds on the approach to the access to the new development,

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which also serves as an access to the existing community centre and the new doctor's surgery. A copy of the plan is attached (Appendix 1). Traffic volumes at the junction have increased significantly as a result of both the housing and the doctor's surgery, adding to the traffic movements which were previously just associated with the community centre.

The proposal was advertised for a period of four weeks until 16th January 2013. During this time no objections were received to the proposal as advertised.

The proposal is in keeping with the Corporate Priorities in attempting to improve road safety and the environment and for encouraging inclusive communities.

PROPOSED DECISION

- 1. That the extension to the 30mph speed limit be introduced as advertised and detailed in the attached schedule (Appendix 2)
- 2. That the Head of Legal Services be authorised to make the necessary Order.

REASON FOR THE PROPOSED DECISION AND OTHER ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED

As the proposed speed limit extension was included in a Section 106 Agreement to offset the transport impact of the proposed development and there were no objections during the advertisement stage, no other alternative options were considered.

RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS:

There are no resource implications, as the cost of progression and implementation of the speed limit will be funded by developer's contributions.

CONSULTATION UNDERTAKEN ON THE PROPOSED DECISION

Requests for formal consent to proceed to advertise were received from the County Councillor, The Police and Hampshire County Council.

Proposal notices were subsequently posted on site and in the Mid Hants Observer.



The scheme is being proposed on traffic management and road safety grounds to reduce vehicle speeds in the vicinity of a new development.

SCHEDULE 1 PROPOSED 30 mph SPEED LIMIT

Name of Road	Description
Mill Lane, Wickham	That length of Mill Lane from a point 420 metres north of the junction of Bridge Street to a point 100 metres north thereof.
