## PROPOSED INDIVIDUAL DECISION BY THE DEPUTY LEADER AND PORTFOLIO HOLDER FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

#### TOPIC - (2012 LEGACY) SPORTS GRANTS: FIRST ROUND 2012/13

#### PROCEDURAL INFORMATION

The Access to Information Procedure Rules – Part 4, Section 22 of the Council's Constitution provides for a decision to be made by an individual member of Cabinet.

#### **SUMMARY**

- The <u>(2012 Legacy) Sports Grants</u> programme provides funding of up to £500 for charitable, voluntary and not-for-profit organisations in the District;
- This programme is intended to support clubs wishing to buy equipment, training, kit or other modest, one-off purchases which would help the clubs to increase participation by Winchester residents of all ages and abilities
- A total of £15,000 was allocated for (2012 Legacy) Sports Grants payments in 2013/14 within the overall Council budget.

 A total of 19 applications have been received. 2 applicants have been asked to reapply for the October round due to their change in request. 1 applicant was based in Ropley which is out of the Winchester & District. 3 applicants were rejected as funding was requested for straight replacement items which gave no additional benefits and is therefore deemed a core running cost.

• This is the first round for 2013/2014.

The Council has traditionally sought to provide support for as many of the eligible applications under this programme as possible. Because the total requested exceeds the amount available, it is not possible to award the full amount of grant requested to all applicants.

#### PROPOSED DECISION(S)

- a) That the recommended awards to be made to local voluntary organisations from the first round of the (2012 Legacy) Sports Grants Programme for 2013/14, as set out in Appendix 1, be approved;
- b) That the Funding & Support Officer, in consultation with the Portfolio Holder, be authorised to *not* to make the recommended award, should officers determine that there are reasonable grounds not to do so, and to reallocate any such monies to the second round of the Small Grants Programme for this financial year.

## REASON FOR THE PROPOSED DECISION AND OTHER ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED

- The recommendations set out at Appendix 1 are made in accordance with the criteria for the (2012 Legacy) Sports Grants Programme.
- Organisations are asked to demonstrate where possible that their project or activity is linked to the delivery of one or more of the SPAA priorities that are set out in the SPAA Framework. These are:-
  - Sporting events
  - Physical activity
  - Grass roots
  - o Facilities
  - Talent
  - Disability Sport

- Officers applied the following principles in determining the recommended awards set out in Appendix 1:
  - a. SPAA priority weightings
- Officers applied the following principles in determining the recommended awards set out in Appendix 1:

a) clearly supports four or more of the above priorities	100%
b) clearly supports three of the above priorities	95%
c) clearly support two of the above priorities	90%

d) clearly supports at least one of the above priorities 85%

e) £250 or less grant amount requested 100%

Although working within the parameters above, the Portfolio Holder has considered some qualitative aspects of the bids. These include:

- value for money (e.g. consideration of the estimated number of beneficiaries);
- the level of credibility of the bid in terms of the way it is structured, evidenced and costed;
- the distinctiveness and creativity of the project proposed.

In no instances is it considered that the awarding of a smaller total than requested will prevent the project or activity from taking place, as they are generally 'scale-able' or the difference can be made up through existing fund raising plans or reserve balances.

The Portfolio Holder considers the proposed awards in Appendix 1 to be fair ones, based on the principles above.

#### **RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS:**

A total of £15,000 was allocated to the (2012 Legacy) Sports Grants Programme as part of the 2013/14 budget (Report CAB2432 dated 13 February 2013, refers) http://www.winchester.gov.uk/meetings/details/1046

There are two rounds for applications the first round in June the allocation is £5509. The remaining £9491 is to be allocated in the second round in November 2013.

The Deputy Leader and Portfolio Holder for Economic Development, in conjunction the SPAA and Sports Development Team, have reviewed the Sports Grant applications with the Funding and Support Officer and further input has been invited from relevant officers from within the Council and from the Corporate Management Team through the drafting of this Decision Notice.

These grants are for a maximum of £500, and officers are increasingly seeking to make the process as time-efficient and streamlined as possible to the benefit of both the voluntary organisations applying and the Council. Consultation is deliberately restricted, with the objective of making rapid decisions based on published criteria and adopted priorities.
