TOPIC - SMALL GRANTS: SECOND ROUND 2013/2014

PROCEDURAL INFORMATION

SUMMARY

- The <u>Small Grants</u> programme provides funding of up to £500 for charitable, voluntary and not-for-profit organisations in the District.
- The programme is intended to support the purchase of small items of equipment, venue hire, printing or other one-off costs associated with a project or activity.
- A total of £15,000 was allocated for Small Grants in 2013/14 within the overall Council budget.
- A total of 25 applications have been received.
- This is the second round for 2013/2014 for activities between October 2013 and March 2014.

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The Council has traditionally sought to provide support for as many of the eligible applications under this programme as possible. Because the total requested exceeds the amount available, it is not possible to award the full amount of grant requested to all applicants in this round.

PROPOSED DECISION

- 1. That the recommended awards to be made to local voluntary organisations from the Second Round of the Small Grants Programme for 2013/14 be approved, as set out in Appendix 1;
- 2. That the Funding & Support Officer be authorised, in consultation with the Portfolio Holder *not* to make the recommended award, should officers determine that there are reasonable grounds not to do so, and to reallocate any such monies to the Third Round of the Small Grants Programme for this financial year.

REASON FOR THE PROPOSED DECISION AND OTHER ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED

- The recommendations set out at Appendix 1 are made in accordance with the criteria for the Small Grants Programme.
- Organisations are asked to demonstrate where possible that their project or activity is linked to the delivery of one or more of the Winchester District Community Strategy priorities. These are:
 - o Promoting the wellbeing of older people
 - Improving access to services
 - o reducing the District's carbon footprint
 - improving the quality of life in the neighbourhoods of Stanmore and Winnall/Highcliffe
- Officers applied the following principles in determining the recommended awards set out in Appendix 1:
 - a. Community Strategy priority weightings
- Officers applied the following principles in determining the recommended awards set out in Appendix 1:
 - a) clearly supports two or more of the above priorities 80%
 - b) clearly supports at least one of the above priorities 70%
 - c) does not support a priority, but supports wider outcome of Active
 Communities 65%

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c) £250 or less requested

100%

Although working within the parameters above, the Portfolio Holder has considered some qualitative aspects of the bids. These include:

- value for money (e.g. consideration of the estimated number of beneficiaries).
- the level of credibility of the bid in terms of the way it is structured, evidenced and costed.
- the distinctiveness and creativity of the project proposed.
- alternative ways of support provided by the Council

In no instances is it considered that the awarding of a smaller total than requested will prevent the project or activity from taking place, as they are generally 'scale-able' or the difference can be made up through existing fund raising plans or reserve balances.

The Portfolio Holder considers the proposed awards in Appendix 1 to be fair ones, based on the principles above.

RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS:

A total of £15,000 was allocated to the Small Grants Programme as part of the 2013/14 budget (CAB2432 refers).

There are two rounds for applications in each year. For the first round in April 2013, the allocation was £10,374. The amended total for round one allocation is £9,574, which leaves a total of £5,426 for second round allocation.

The total recommended awards for second round of small grants as set out in Appendix 1 is £5,415.

CONSULTATION UNDERTAKEN ON THE PROPOSED DECISION

The Deputy Leader has reviewed the Small Grant applications with the Funding and Support Officer and further input has been invited from relevant officers from within the Council and from the Corporate Management Team through the drafting of this Decision Notice.

These grants are for a maximum of £500, and officers are increasingly seeking to make the process as time-efficient and streamlined as possible to the benefit of both the voluntary organisations applying and the Council. Consultation is deliberately restricted, with the objective of making rapid decisions based on published criteria and adopted priorities.
