Nestling in the heart of the picturesque Meon Valley countryside, yet just a stone's throw away from the historic cities of Winchester and Portsmouth, is the medieval village of Wickham: a delightful day out for visitors to the South of England.

The village has been a meeting point and centre of commerce since Roman times and whilst Wickham has evolved, its charm has remained constant. The handsome Square is at the heart of this historic Hampshire village, always alive with residents and visitors, and a great place to stroll or stop for a bite. If time allows, a meander along the historic Meon Valley Trail is a relaxing way to work up an appetite for supper in one of Wickham's excellent eateries.

Named 'Hampshire Calor Village of the Year' in 2007, Wickham is a great place to spend a day. Whether it is the countryside, the architectural diversity, the fascinating shops or the tempting cuisine that draws you to Wickham, one thing's for sure: you're bound to return.





Formerly spelt ‘Wykeham’, the village’s name derives from the Anglo-Saxon ‘wic’, meaning ‘creek’, and ‘ham’, meaning ‘home’, suggesting that the earliest settlers were attracted to the location as it featured a ford which crossed the River Meon. The river has certainly played an important part in the development of the area: a ‘dip hole’ (above right) with steps down to the river, which enabled villagers to draw water, can still be seen in Bridge Street.

Did you know?
 After the murder of the princes in the Tower of London, Sir William Uvedale of Wickham rebelled against Richard III and lost his titles. Restored by Henry VII, he was further awarded the honour of Knight of the Bath.

Wickham is mentioned in the Royal Charter of 826, at which point it was thought that a Saxon settlement was well established on the east side of the river, and by 1086 Wickham was deemed significant enough to feature in the Domesday Book. A noteworthy development for the village occurred in 1269, when the Lord of the Manor was given the rights to hold a market and a fair here. These rights continue to be enjoyed by residents and visitors today.

Alongside the River Meon, road and rail links have played a major part in the village’s continuing development, firmly cementing it as a centre of commerce. It was a major crossing point between two Roman roads (which ran from Winchester in the west to Chichester in the east, and from Portchester to Southampton), although historians remain divided as to whether there was actually a Roman settlement here. The Victorian route, opened in 1903, linked London with the Isle of Wight - local strawberry growers used the line to send their best fruit to London. Closed in 1955, the disused track now forms part of the Meon Valley Trail - a footpath, cycle route and bridleway running from Knowle to West Meon (see overleaf).

Evidence of Wickham’s commercial past is still apparent in The Square and at Chesapeake Mill. The Square, still a thriving centre of trade, preserves its medieval characteristics - many buildings have narrow frontages on long plots of land.

No history of Wickham can be complete without a mention of the village’s most famous resident, William Wykeham, who was born here in 1320. Twice Lord Chancellor and also a Bishop of Winchester, William is credited with being the founder of Winchester College and New College Oxford, as well as building a significant part of Windsor Castle.

1 Wickham Square



The magnificent Wickham Square is one of the largest in the country, covering nearly two acres. On arrival, look up to take in the wonderfully erratic roofline. This gives you a glimpse of the historical context of this pretty village before you go on to take in its diverse tapestry of architecture at street level. From 15th Century cottages to beautifully preserved

examples of majestic Georgian houses, first time visitors always appreciate the architectural details that await them on a stroll around this handsome Square. You will also find an interesting array of shops and eateries to suit any taste.

2 Chesapeake Mill

If you’ve an eye for a bargain, or you simply like to browse, make sure you allow an hour or two to visit Chesapeake Mill. A fascinating link to Hampshire’s maritime history, this extraordinary Grade II* listed mill, built in 1820, incorporates timber from the US Frigate *Chesapeake*, captured by the British *HMS Shannon* in 1813 (see illustrations on page 11). A working mill for much of its life, this grand building is now full to the brim with exclusive collections of antiques, home furnishings, art and jewellery, as well as a tea room and much more. In fact, you never know quite what you will find. Chesapeake Mill is open every day, except Mondays, from 10am (11am on Sundays and Bank Holidays). 3 Wickham Water Meadows



These naturally formed water meadows, covering approximately eight acres, form a tranquil oasis in the middle of the village. Owned by the Lord of the Manor until the early part of the 20th Century, the water meadows were used for cattle grazing. However, thanks to the foresight and hard work of local residents and volunteers, the area has been transformed, complete with a new bridge across the River Meon, paths, benches and a picnic area. Now it’s a peaceful place to walk, picnic or simply spend some time by the water’s edge.

4 St Nicholas Church

Dating back to 1120, this delightful brick and flint church is said to stand on the site of an earlier chapel, and sits on a very large, almost circular, sacred mound. The church has been extended several times and underwent significant restoration in the late 19th Century – so although the interior is largely Victorian, there is a distinctive array of bygone features. These include the Norman west door with its unusual zig zag arch, stained glass windows and the impressively detailed alabaster and marble tomb of Sir William Uvedale, treasurer of the King’s Privy Chamber and Sheriff of Hampshire, which dates from the year of his death in 1615. Wickham is a little paradise for those who enjoy getting out and about as it is surrounded by some of the most beautiful countryside in Hampshire. There are many walking, cycling and riding trails that will take you through woods, fields and water meadows. So why not have a meander around the Meon Valley and see what you discover?

The Meon Valley Trail

Wickham marks the start of the much-loved Meon Valley Trail which stretches north for nine miles along the route of the old Meon Valley Railway, towards the village of West Meon. Here it connects with the South Downs Way and Wayfarers' Walk, enabling you to create an extended circular route. The route is level and passes by various hamlets and country pubs making it a path to be enjoyed at any pace. Park in Station Close Car Park for fast access to the trail and additional facilities. The Wickham Wander



For walkers, why not try a circular route of about five miles which takes in woodland and a visit to Wickham's historic St Nicholas Church? Park in Station Close Car Park for access to the walk. Further facilities and a picnic area are available courtesy of the Forestry Commission en route. North Fields

This countryside trail will take you on a circular route to the North of Wickham. Reasonably level, it takes about an hour and a half but may be heavy going for pushchairs and wheelchairs. A great route for cyclists. Park in the Community Centre Car Park to begin the route.

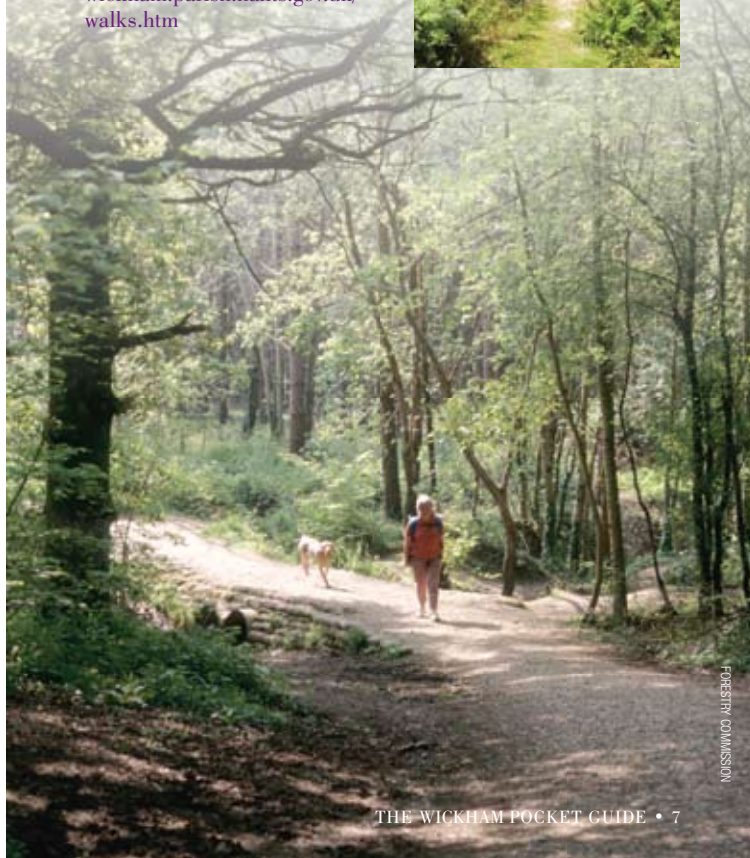
The Meadows Meander



Allow an hour and a half for this level walk, which takes in the scenic water meadows as well as the local vineyard. A picnic area is situated by the water meadows to allow you to take in the scenery before returning to The Square. Some steep steps in the water meadows can be avoided by finishing the walk via Wickham Square. Park in Station Close Car Park. For details and a map visit: www.wickham.parish.hants.gov.uk/walks.htm

Heytesbury Farm Ramble

A circular path which explores the terrain to the South of Wickham, this walk is approximately three miles long and takes in woodland, farmland and rural lanes as well as urban roads. • From M27 Westbound from Portsmouth/Chichester

Leave at Junction 10, following the A32, signposted Alton. Cross the mini roundabout. At the next roundabout take the exit marked A334 into Wickham.

• From A31 from Farnham/Guildford

From the A31, take a left turn onto the A32 at Chawton roundabout. At the Wickham roundabout take the second exit onto the A334 and head into Wickham.

• From M3 from Winchester/Basingstoke

Leave at Junction 11 onto the B3335. Take the left hand fork onto the B3334 Main Road and then turn left onto the B2177 Portsmouth Road. At the roundabout continue ahead on the B2177 through Shedfield. Go straight on to the A334 for Wickham.

There's so much to see in Wickham throughout the year, so if you're looking to discover the true character of an historic English village why not time your visit to coincide with one of the annual events? Exact dates and further details can be found on the Wickham Parish Council website at www.wickham.parish.hants.gov.uk. Here's just a taste...

On 20 May each year **Wickham Horse Fair** takes place. During this traditional event the travelling community sell and race ponies and horses and a fun fair fills The Square. Please be aware there is no official parking available during the event and road closures affect access to the village during the day.

No English village summer would be complete without a jolly good fête! Happily, there are several that take place annually in and around Wickham on Saturdays in June. Look out for the **Wickham Church & Village Fête** in the middle of the month and neighbouring **Shedfield Fête** at the end of the month. **Wickham Primary School's Summer Fayre** takes place in mid-July.

The annual **Wickham Duck Race**, also traditionally in June, raises funds for local organisations such as the primary school and scouts. Everyone is welcome to turn up and join in the fun!

September brings with it **Heritage Open Weekend**, designed to open up access to the District's cultural and architectural heritage. Come to Wickham on this weekend for out of the ordinary events - past activities include a family treasure hunt by bicycle along the old Meon Valley Railway and a special tour around Park Place Pastoral Centre.

Christmas shoppers looking for something a little different should visit Wickham in November for **Making Merry Open Studios**. This annual event showcases artistic talent at more than fifty venues throughout the Winchester District and has become immensely popular. Details of open studios in and around Wickham can be found by visiting www.visitwinchester.co.uk.

In December, **Father Christmas** visits The Square to turn on Wickham's Christmas tree lights. The Parish Council organises entertainment from local groups with seasonal refreshments on offer. Vintage cars and motorbikes fill the village for the annual **Boxing Day Rally** – an eye-catching opportunity to stretch the legs after Christmas Day.

There are plenty of things to see and do around Wickham if you're planning to stay a little longer and want to get out and about. Aside from the charming collection of walks and trails, a short journey by car or public transport will reveal an interesting array of tempting days out...

Wickham Vineyard

Discover the pleasure of English wine and fine cuisine in a beautiful Hampshire vineyard. Established in 1984, the vineyard now extends to 18 acres. An audio guide provides a fascinating estate tour and describes the history of English wine, the development of the vineyard and the work throughout the year. There's a tasting room and visitors are also welcome to roam the adjoining 7.5 acre woodland and wetland nature reserve. Wickham Vineyard is open every day including bank holidays. Wickham Park Golf Course



Set in the heart of the beautiful Meon Valley, this 18-hole parkland course is balanced to offer a relaxing yet challenging round for members and visitors alike. Royal Armouries – Fort Nelson



Head east and up to Portsdown Hill for fabulous views of the Meon Valley and the South Coast and a glimpse of South Hampshire's Victorian history. One of an impressive chain of forts, sited on the ridge of the hill, Fort Nelson was built in the 1860s to protect Britain from a feared French invasion. Now the fort is fully restored and is home to the Royal Armouries artillery collection. Covering every period of history from every corner of the world, the collection is brought vividly to life every day with the live firing of one of the great guns.
