"My great great grandson, William Spyle was a farmer on Stannome before he was an actor. He lived in Top Farm, which was situated just down the road from the farm where Stannome House was built in 1815. At that time there were 104 people in it. There's a newspaper article I have here where he was interviewed about life on the farm and his old age. He talks about haphaving on the farm and there's a pain of his. Also, my great grandson and one of my family grew up and worked on the farm, although everything was interrupted by the First world war, with many of them going off to fight and others they were killed. William Spyle moved into one of the first houses built in Stannome ham, with his daughter where he lived up to the peak of his life. He's buried with his wife in St. Cross."
