Dear Mr Blackman,

Please see below the Inspector's reply to your query.

*'In the light of the recent S of S decision on the redetermined CALA Homes appeal at Barton Farm, Winchester, the examination of the JCS need no longer focus on the principle of the WT2 allocation/development of the site for new housing etc, as no recommendation made by the Inspector in that context could directly affect the outline permission granted.*

*It remains relevant for the Inspector to examine the soundness of policy WT2 relating to the implementation and delivery of the allocation, as any alternative or amended scheme that may come forward would have to be judged against the adopted development plan (also taking into account all other relevant material considerations).*

*Accordingly, an amendment is being made to the hearings programme to hold the Barton Farm session at 1530 on Day 3 (Thursday 1 November) and North Whiteley at 0930 on Day 4 (Friday 2 November).*

*Otherwise, the impact (if any) of the decision is largely a matter for representors to take into account in their further written submissions by the relevant deadline and for the Council to take into account in their responses.'*
