WHAT TO DO IF THERE IS A FIRE

IF A FIRE BREAKS OUT IN YOUR HOME:

- Leave the room where the fire is straight away and close the door.
- Tell everyone in your home and get them to leave.
- Do not collect personal belongings.
- Do not stay behind to put the fire out.
- Close your entrance door behind you.
- Wait outside, away from the building.
- Call the Fire and Rescue Service - dial 999 or 112.
- Await instructions from the Fire Service before going back into the building.

IF YOU LIVE IN A BLOCK AND SEE OR HEAR A FIRE IN ANOTHER PART OF THE BUILDING:

- Call the Fire and Rescue Service - dial 999 or 112 if safe to do so
- You must leave immediately if smoke or heat affects you or your home, or you are told to leave by the Fire Service.
- If you are likely to need help evacuating the property in an emergency contact the local Fire Service and ask for a Safe & Well visit. They will talk through an evacuation plan with you.
- Contact Housing 01962 848 400 to find out the evacuation plan that's advised for your property.

Fire Protection Measures for Your Home

- Provision of smoke alarms in your home.
- How to keep safe information – leaflets, website, social media, Tenants Handbook.

Measures for those living in flats within blocks

- Fire risk assessment – your block is checked regularly to make sure fire safety measures are adequate. If you want to know:
 - how regularly - contact the Housing Hub 01962 848 400
 - details of the latest fire risk assessment go to the website winchester.gov.uk/housing/fire-safety
- Smoke alarms in communal areas.
- Design of the building - compartmentation – this is checked through fire risk assessment.
- Flat entrance door and doors to communal areas.
- Signage – displayed near the exits.
- For other measures specific to your block contact Sheltered Housing Team.

Winchester City Council Responsibilities

- Complete fire risk assessments on blocks of flats.
- Complete regular health & safety checks.
- Test the smoke alarm in your home.
- Make arrangements to remove and dispose of the items blocking emergency exits and communal areas. Take enforcement action on those known to be responsible and charge removal costs.
- Manage and maintain the fire protection measures present for your home for which it is responsible.

Advice on How to Keep Safe



Your Responsibilities

- Follow the keep safe guidance.
- Report concerns regarding fire safety to Winchester City Council.
- Allow access for the annual gas appliance & smoke alarm check.
- Have an escape plan and know the fire evacuation plan for your property. hantsfire.gov.uk/safety/home-safe-home/be-prepared/ gives advice on what to think about when putting your plan together.
- Do not store flammable materials in your home, including on balconies.
- Keep communal areas and landings clear, so exit routes are not obstructed.
- Do not leave large unwanted household items in bin areas.
- You are not permitted to change/modify your front door, fit a cat flap or fit/change a letterbox.
- Ask for permission to carry out works to your home as otherwise you may affect the fire safety measures and put yourself and others at risk.

Remember Let us Know:

- If you go into hospital.
- When you come home from hospital.
- Any change that affects your ability to leave your home if there was a fire.

Frequently Asked Questions

Why don't you carry out fire drills?

Fire drills are not appropriate unless there is a communal fire alarm. The fire risk assessments will determine whether fire drills are required.

How to get out if there's a fire in my flat?

Speak to the sheltered team who can check whether you qualify for a Safe and Well visit from the local Fire Service to go through escape plan advice or check the Hantsfire website for advice on how to be prepared.
