 Open Space Strategy Sites



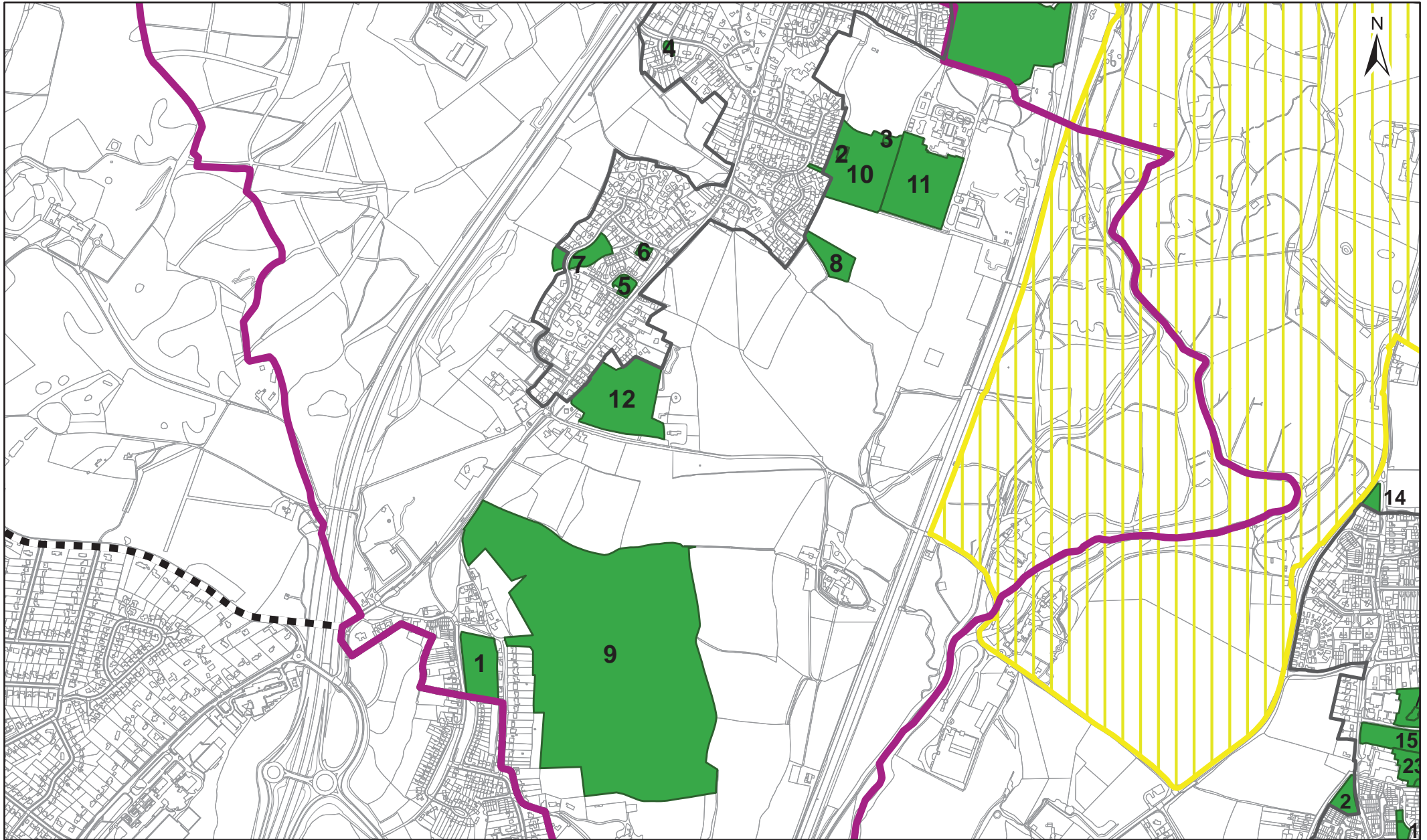
