The deer park is recorded in the Domesday Survey as a hunting park, but documentary sources suggest it may have originated as a Saxon land holding. The pale comprises a wide bank and ditch and may originally have had a fence or hedge on top of the bank. This boundary has not been designated as a Scheduled Monument, although other deer park boundaries have been protected as such. Additionally, a large pot containing Roman gold, silver and bronze coins was found in a field opposite Forest Farm in the early part of the 19th century (MWC25). Only antiquarian records exist for this find, so it is unclear whether it might relate to any features of archaeological interest within the site.	Amber/Red	Any upstanding or sub-surface remains of the deer park pale that survive within the site may form a constraint. However, there are unlikely to be internal park features within the site. A sufficient area around the surviving park pale earthwork should be retained to prevent disturbance during development. Given the size of the site, it is also possible that previously unrecognised archaeological remains could survive <i>in situ</i> across this area. Further assessment will be required.
