<p>Havant Borough Council</p> <p>Havant and Waterlooville Centres</p>	<p>Havant's two centres are managed by the Horizon Leisure Trust – there have been some issues in recent years that have included a limited programme and use of short-term solutions.</p> <p>An analysis of users by consultants identifies migration from Winchester and East Hants sub regions</p>	<p>Programming at the centres has been a constraint – needing more consideration of Sport Development and community needs</p>	<p>Havant BC engaged consultants to undertake a fundamental management review in 2006, and a feasibility study into a possible replacement centre is due early in 2008. A contribution of almost £1m has been negotiated from the MDA development for provision of leisure facilities in the District.</p>
<p>Eastleigh Borough Council</p> <p>Fleming Park Leisure Centre</p>	<p>Fleming Park is used by a wide range of users including the Winchester Indoor Hockey League</p>	<p>Fleming Park is a well-used facility which has had a number of improvements in recent years. These have enabled the Centre to maintain levels of service to users and improve attendances</p>	<p>Eastleigh BC is planning to undertake a similar review of future indoor and outdoor leisure provision, including a review of community leisure facilities on education sites.</p>

<p>Test Valley Borough Council</p> <p>Romsey Rapids and Andover Leisure Centre</p>	<p>Both centres are managed by Valley Leisure which has a contract to 2017. There is evidence from two recent NBS surveys of catchments extending into the Winchester District.</p>	<p>Centres are well used and effectively managed – improvements have been undertaken - £3M at Romsey Rapids and £1.3M at Andover LC.</p>	<p>Major redevelopment is proposed for Andover LC linking with the College and Magistrates Court to develop into a 'cultural quarter' which will include arts, sports, educational and wellbeing services.</p>
<p>Fareham Borough Council</p> <p>Fareham Leisure Centre</p>	<p>The Leisure Centre is managed by SLM until 2014 – a number of improvements have been made – it appears to have a predominantly local catchment</p>	<p>Quest Score - 69%. Some pricing issues which may have led to a reduction in use by some target groups.</p>	<p>SLM are a recent addition to the area as a leisure contractor – and although they are Midlands based they have also won a contract in Poole. It can be expected that they will be bidding for other contracts to consolidate their business.</p>
<p>Gosport District Council</p> <p>Holbrook and St Vincent Leisure Centres</p>	<p>Contractor is Arena Leisure Group on a short-term contract until 2009. Limited number of improvements and local catchments – no known migration from Winchester..</p>	<p>Holbrook RC - Quest Assessment of 2003 - 60% – No leisure card in place so non-residents use is not restricted.</p>	<p>Possible proposals for the development of a new centre in the Borough – aiming for completion in 2010/11.</p>
<p>East Hampshire District Council</p> <p>Alton Sports Centre Chawton Park Indoor Bowls Club</p>	<p>EHDC centres attract residents from the east of Winchester District for swimming, gymnastics, climbing and other activities at the Sports Centre.</p>	<p>Inadequate public transport is an issue.</p>	<p>Implications linked to the possible future refurbishment or relocation of the Alton Sports Centre.</p>
