

Notice of Making of Various Road Traffic Regulation Orders
Affecting the District of Winchester City Council

On 11th August 2014 Winchester City Council as agents for Hampshire County Council made the undermentioned road traffic regulation orders:-

1. The Hampshire (Various Roads, Central, Winchester)(20 Miles per Hour Speed Limit) Order 2014

The effect of this order, proposals for which were advertised on 22nd January 2014 will be to introduce a 20 mile per hour speed limit in various roads in Winchester City Centre. Details are as follows:-

The above order will come into operation on 18th August 2014

Copies of the orders, maps showing the locations and a statement of reasons for each of the above orders and the orders to be varied may be inspected during usual office hours at the City Offices, Colebrook Street, Winchester.

Any person who wishes to question the validity of any of the above orders or any of the provisions of the orders on the grounds that they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with may, within six weeks of the date when the orders were made apply to the High Court for that purpose.
