Welcome to the Neighbourhood Campaign

Loan Shark Campaign

On the 17th September 2018 the "don't get bitten by a loan shark" Campaign was launched by Winchester City Council

The signing was organised in conjunction with the England Illegal Money Lending Team (IMLT) to raise awareness of the problem and help people in the local community.

The partnership will raise awareness of illegal money lending, secure prosecutions and work with local organisations in Winchester and the wider district to ensure people in the hands of loan sharks are able to access appropriate advice, affordable credit and other sources of support.

What is a Loan Shark?

A loan shark, not to be confused with a high cost legal lender, is someone who lends money without the permission required by the Financial Services and Markets Act 2000. Permission is given by the Financial Conduct Authority to individuals or companies whom they believe are "fit and proper". Loan Shark activity is characterised by deliberate criminal activity, with extortionate rates of interest charged on loans that mean borrowers can face demands for payment of thousands of pounds more than they borrowed and can often never pay off the loans. Borrowers who fail to pay or refuse to pay can be subject to intimidation, humiliation and extreme physical violence.

National & Hampshire Campaigns

Action Fraud warns shoppers to stay tuned to fraud as £6.5 million is lost to gift card fraud

Action Fraud is warning the public to #StayTunedToFraud as fraudsters are contacting victims, claiming to be from well-known organisations including <u>Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs</u>



(HMRC). Fraudsters are then tricking victims into making payments using iTunes gift cards.

How to protect yourself from gift card fraudsters:

Gift cards, including App Store and iTunes gift cards can only be used to purchase goods and services from the retailer named on the card. No genuine organisation will ask you to pay taxes, bills or fees using iTunes Gift Cards, or any other type of voucher.

If you're contacted by anyone that asks you to do this, you're very likely the target of a scam.

• If you think you have been a victim of fraud, <u>report it to Action Fraud online</u> or by calling 0300 123 2040.

Operation Rogue Trader



The Community Safety & Neighbourhood Services Team will once again be supporting the Op Rogue Trader Campaign by reminding residents to be aware of rogue traders & door step crime.

Offenders knock on the door pretending to be

someone else. They may then:

- distract you to get in and steal items, sometimes with an accomplice
- pretend to have lost a pet
- claim they need to use your home phone
- claim they're from the council, a utility supplier (water or gas, for example) or even police.

ADVICE - If it's an emergency, call 999 now.

If you're not sure, don't open the door.

Halloween will soon be upon us, and as always advice to children and their parents is to be mindful that some of the more vulnerable or elderly members of the community may not wish to participate in the Halloween activities and can at times feel intimidated by groups of people calling at their doors.With this in mind, below is some advice for the elderly or vulnerable members of our community staying home this Halloween:

If you do not know who is calling at your house
you do not need to open the door

- Try to see who is at the door by looking through a spy hole or window before opening the door, if you have a chain on your door – keep this in place when opening the door
- If you feel threatened in your home please contact police.

Don't make an empty home easy for burglars to spot when it's dark.

Home security advice

For greater home security you can consider the following:

 Leave lights on to make your home look occupied



- Invest in timers that will automatic switch lamps and devices on and off
- Gadgets are available that turn your main lights on and off
- Help lower your bills with energy saving bulbs
- Thieves target homes that look empty
- Shut and lock all windows and doors when going out
- Only tell people you trust when going away
- Now you've protected your home, share our advice with family and friends
