



Recycling bin

✓ YES please!

Clean paper (incl. magazines, newspaper, junk mail, catalogues)	Cardboard (Not greasy items, such as pizza boxes)	Food cans
Drinks cans	Aerosols	Plastic bottles (without caps)

X NO thank you!

Plastic pots tubs and tray's	Drinks cartons	Plastic bags	Non recyclable paper (incl. shredded, gift wrap, wet/ soiled, tissues, paper towels, photographs)
Food and garden waste	Cling film	Polystyrene	Tin foil

Remember to keep your recycling: **CLEAN** | **DRY** | **LOOSE** to avoid contamination. No carrier bags or black bags.



Glass collection box

✓ YES please!

Glass bottles such as wine, beer, cooking oil and perfume
Glass jars, including clear and coloured glass

Please ensure all bottles and jars are empty and clean

X NO thank you!

Lids, corks or tops	Spectacles	Vases	Light bulbs and tubes
Cookware	Crocery	Nail varnish bottles	Mirrors, sheet glass and window panes



Refuse bin

What **CANNOT** be put in your household refuse bin

- Stones or brick rubble
- DIY material
- Paint / chemicals or oil
- Hot ashes
- Clinical waste (we provide a free domestic service for this)
- Commercial, trade or industrial waste
- Scrap metal
- Poisonous or noxious waste
- Garden waste
- Electrical products

Please try and recycle as much as you can!

Some items that are not accepted in your kerbside recycling bin such as clothing and textiles can still be recycled through charity clothing banks. Remaining non-recyclable waste (household refuse) is incinerated, generating energy which is fed back in to the National Grid.



Garden waste

✓ YES please!

- Grass cuttings
- Hedge cuttings
- Weeds
- Small branches (max 10cm diameter)
- Leaves (small amounts)
- Prunings

Max. weight: 15kg

All garden waste collected goes to a composting site in Hampshire and is made into organic soil conditioner, widely used in local parks and formal gardens. You should try to compost as much of your garden and kitchen waste as possible, as this is better for the environment and saves on fuel and transportation costs.

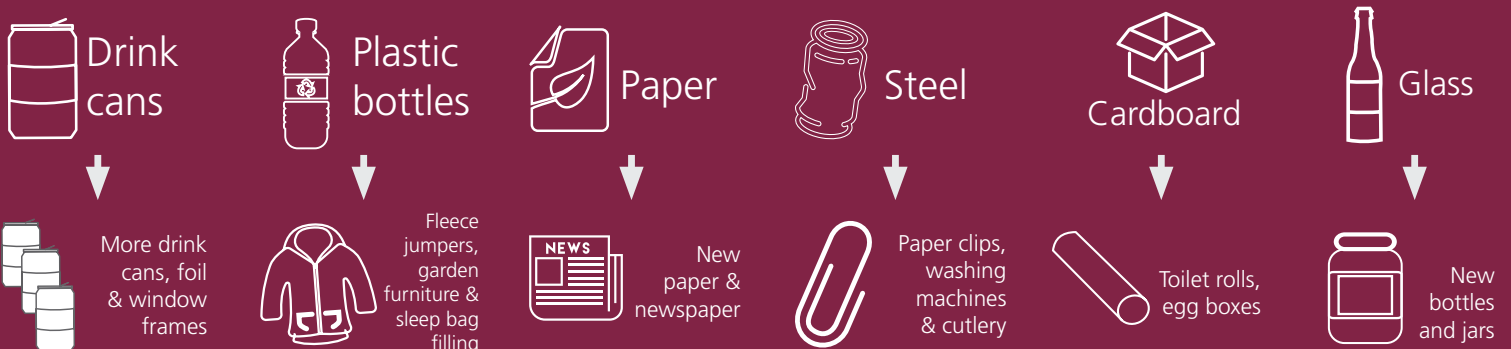

Where does my waste go and what happens to it?

The recycling lorry takes your waste to the Materials Recycling Facility (MRF). Inside the MRF, the waste is emptied and sorted into the different types of material. These sorted materials are then sent to factories to turn the old waste into new items:
