CONSULTATION FEEDBACK

NEW HOMES AT WINNALL FLATS

The consultation attracted good numbers, with 60-70 people coming along to speak with us.

There was a mix of views on the ideas we have. The overall feeling was positive, and this was shown in the responses, of which 10 were generally supportive, eight were against and eight did not commit either way.

Environment

Keeping and improving green space was clearly important to people. There was a strong call to keep trees, and ideas such as small play areas and quiet sitting areas were popular. There were requests for dog walking and exercising areas to be kept separate from the other communal spaces. We were told that the area around the flats has become a popular dog walking area for people from across Winnall and that residents at the flats would like to see addressed.

Social

Many of the responses about the space around the flats asked for it to be designed in a way that encourages people to socialise.

Parking

Another area of importance was parking. Some comments stressed that high priority should be given to the design and layout to make parking easier. There was also good support for small parking courts, even if this means using some of the other open space around the flats.

Construction period

Residents were concerned about the construction period, the noise levels it would create and the inconvenience it would be to those already living there. The loss of current parking spaces whilst the work was completed was also a concern, and it is clear that we will need to think carefully about temporary parking arrangements during the construction period.

Existing buildings

Finally, a number of people stressed the need to focus on issues with the existing flats. There was a concern that these would be forgotten as the new homes would be the focus of all the attention.
