What has happened?

Activity levels on-site are increasing as the project continues to take shape. The final section of the steel frame is now underway and will be complete by Christmas. We have also started to install the roof decking, completing two of the five main roof areas.

The construction of the reinforced structure to the hydrotherapy pool is now complete, which has allowed us to commence the construction of the ground floor slabs.

We have started to install filtration pipework to both the main, learner, and hydrotherapy pools. The pipework will link all of the pools to the filtration plant room to support the operation of the pools.

We are continuing to form the new road and roundabout to the project within the site boundary. These works include BT duct and cable diversionary works, drainage, and the construction of the road formation.

In agreement with Hampshire County Council, works to divert and install the new power supplies for the project will start on 13th January 2020 for 9 weeks.

These works will include the use of traffic management on Bar End Road, which may cause some disruption to your journeys. We apologise in advance for any inconvenience caused.



What happens next?

Throughout December we will be focusing on:

- Completion of the steel frame and pre-cast plank installation
- Continuing the external walls and filtration pipework to both the main and hydrotherapy pools
- Construction of the car park and off line works to the connection to Bar End Road are ongoing which will allow BT to make their necessary connections.
- Preparing for the roof, façade and internal works in order to progress in the New Year, when our roofers, cladders and bricklayers will join the team.



Other news

Our Building Lives Academy continues to provide a training programme to local individuals. The November tranche was attended by seven trainees, with all individuals completing the course. The December course dates have been set and the programme will run for two weeks.

We are continuing to engage with local schools and have contributed prizes to All Saints Primary School.
