

How can we all work together to protect our planet for the future? What will each of us do to make a difference – locally and beyond? What learning can we share?

The aim of this activity is to stimulate discussion about the environment between generations. We are asking young people to write to someone older in the local community saying why they care about the environment and what they are doing to care for it.



The older person then replies in a similar way in return (see instructions below and template on next page).

We hope to use quotes from these letters, during Green Week 2020, to spread the message to care for our world.

Instructions

To the young person:

- 1. Please tell your parent or carer that you're taking part in this activity.
- Together with your parent or carer, please identify an older person you'd like to write to. This could be your grandparent or another relative, an older neighbour, a teacher or a coach, someone in your church, for example.
- 3. Write your letter to the older person you've identified, using the template in this document. Please only write in the left-hand box with the light green border. (Leave the right-hand box with the dark green border blank.)
- 4. In your letter, explain why you care about the environment and what you are doing to look after it. You could ask the person you're writing to some questions, too!
- 5. Feel free to decorate the letter border as well, if you'd like to.
- 6. Send your letter (by hand, post or email) ... and wait for the reply!
- 7. Finally: Please ask your parent/carer to email a scanned copy or photograph of your letters to Winchester Green Week winchestergreenweek@gmail.com

To the older person:

- Enjoy reading the letter you've received!
- 2. Please write your reply to the young person concerned. Please write in the right-hand box with the dark green border.
- In your letter, explain why you care about the environment and what you are doing to look after it so future generations can enjoy it too.
- 4. If you'd like to add some decorations as well, please feel free!
- 5. Please send/give this whole document (i.e. the letter you received and your reply) back to the young person concerned.

Let's get creative!

We want to make Green Week look like a festival by creating together a stream of 'bunting' in the shop windows of the High Street and side streets across Winchester District – to share a big, creative message, of our hopes and vision for doing more together to live sustainably (or if the COVID situation changes, in one huge installation).

Make your flag to add to the bunting, ask your friends and each person in your family to make one, and we will do the work of joining them all up together. The more flags we get, the longer the bunting.



Instructions

Each flag can be made of paper, fabric or any recycled materials – whatever you have lying around. Just make sure it is the dimensions we explain below so it will fit together! Add your 'message' on the flag. Share your hopes for how...



we can be a sustainable city



we can work together



we can take climate action



we can be responsible consumers



we can protect wildlife

Your message can be expressed as a picture, some text or a mixture of the two – it might be painted, sewn or just written in pen. A drawing, word, photo, poem, or a question about how we can be 'doing more together', the choice is down to you!

Making

- Size start with something A4 in size (paper, fabric, card, newspaper...)
- Follow the easy guidelines on the next page to make sure all our bunting ends up the same size so we can join it together
- Decorate in any way you like but include your message of hope.

How to get your art work to us:

All the bunting flags need to be collected in by Friday 11th September so that we can put them together and display them in time for Winchester Green Week. As the COVID situation changes our ways to gather the flags may change, so:

- If you heard about this project through a group (e.g. school, church, uniformed organisation) please give your completed flag to the leader of your group. Leaders, please contact winchestergreenweek@gmail.com to arrange collection early in the Autumn term.
- If you are working on this project independently (i.e. not through a group) please contact winchestergreenweek@gmail.com to tell us you have a flag
- OR email a photo of your flag to winchestergreenweek@gmail.com



Guidelines for bunting flags

Make a **rectangle** or **triangle** shape as below:



- Size –
 start with something A4 in size
 (21cm x 29.5cm)
- Fold down a 4cm strip across the top
- Secure this along its bottom edge - by sewing, staples or strong sticky tape – forming a tube where we will put ribbon or twine to string them together
- You can leave the shape like that as a rectangle OR...
- ...you can make this into a triangle shape by cutting down from the bottom edges of the tube to the middle of the bottom part of the flag.
- Decorate in any way you like but with a message.
- Make sure you add your flag to all the others for this Images of Hope project (see details of how to get your work to us on p5)

- . It can be 2D or 3D. Get creative and add as much detail as possible.

Build a bird, hedgehog or bat box

- . Using materials you have lying around the garden (ask permission and for help) build something to help wild animals in the garden.
- Birds and bats love having somewhere to nest and rest and hedgehogs need a shelter during the day and somewhere to hibernate in the winter. How to build your own hedgehog house here! How to build a bat box here!

Upcycle your clothes

How to build a bird table here!


- · Upcycle your old and unwanted clothes that can't be donated.
