
The Parish Council has the power to spend money on community transport, traffic calming, crime prevention, youth projects, tourism activities, leisure facilities, community centres, car parks, recreation grounds, entertainment, street furniture, street cleaning, allotments, bus shelters and land.

It comments on planning applications and can be represented at public inquiries. It is likely to be granted more powers to negotiate with the local principal authorities and take on additional responsibilities.

# **MANAGING SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT**

- Recommend traffic management solutions to mitigate impact of developments


- Publicise Bishop's Waltham outside the parish to increase footfall

## **HOW THE PARISH COUNCIL WORKS**

The Parish Council comprises fourteen Councillors who are elected every four years. They are unpaid and are governed by a mandatory code of conduct which includes obligations to act in an appropriate manner. Each Councillor serves on at least two or more Committees, as well as attending the monthly Parish Council meetings.

The Council has a Chair, who is one of the elected Councillors.

Councillors have three main components to their work:

- Decision making on money spent, services delivered and policies implemented
- Monitoring the efficiency and effectiveness of services
- Local involvement in the wider community and local organisations.

### **COUNCIL EMPLOYEES**

The Council's Executive Officer is the principal advisor to the Council, being required to give clear guidance to Councillors before decisions are reached.

The other employees are the Deputy Executive Officer, the Responsible Finance Officer, the Administration Assistant, Halls Manager, Senior Groundsman, Groundstaff, Lengthsman, Caretakers and the Accredited Community Safety Officer.
