1 Introduction

1.1_Background

This document, the **First Stage Consultation Summary: Walking Tours** sets out the findings of the initial public consultation carried out in developing the North Walls Park Plan.

The consultant team working on the project were supplied with a list of 60 names and organisations by Winchester City Council to be consulted. The list of consultees is provided opposite.

A series of walking tours were organised by Feria Urbanism over three days during September and October 2020. The aim was to engage with local users in the park setting in order to find out first hand any issues facing the park and ideas about its future.

For each of the three days consultees were invited to join a group from one of four one hour slots available. In following Covid-19 social distancing requirements at the time groups were limited to a maximum of 6 people.

The walking tours took place on:

- Tuesday 29 September 2020
- Wednesday 30 September 2020
- Thursday 1 October 2020

One of the key benefits of walking around the park in groups was the opportunity to exchange experiences and share ideas with one another.

1.2_Walking Tours Attendance

Whilst a total of 28 consultees signed up to the walkabouts, only 25 attended the tours (42% turn out of the total list).
