# Heating Servicing and maintenance – Contractor change

We are pleased to announce that from 1st October 2021, the council will be working with different contractors to carry out the maintenance of our heating systems and associated services. Correct Contract Services (CCS) will take over heating repairs and gas servicing in all of our tenanted properties from PH Jones.

CCS pride itself on offering a customer-focused service, dedicated to getting the work completed

quickly and efficiently and have an excellent track record in the delivery of heating servicing and repairs for residents.

CCS's contract with the council covers the annual maintenance and repair of all forms of heating and hot water services. These include Gas, Oil, Solid fuel/Biomass and electrical heating (such as Air Source Heat Pumps). The council has a legal obligation to carry out safety checks to tenanted properties on an annual basis, so you must allow us access to your home to enable the check to be completed. Failure to allow us access may put your tenancy at risk.

If your annual service visit is due after 1st October CCS will be writing to you in due course to book an appointment. If the appointment time given is not convenient, please contact CCS directly to arrange a more suitable time. CCS can be reached using the following:

### Tackle damp and mould before the winter

People often complain of damp and mould at home in the winter months. Follow our top tips below to help reduce condensation which causes mould:

- When you're cooking, or taking a shower or bath keep the door closed, open the windows and turn on the extractor fan.
- Keep surfaces dry and wipe away any condensation.
- Don't block any extractor fans or air bricks. Keep trickle vents on windows open.
- Try not to dry laundry indoors as it will make your home damp. If you have to use a tumble drier make sure it is vented to the outside.
- Leave a small gap between furniture and the wall to keep air flowing.
- Make sure your home is adequately heated during cold weather. It is better to have the heating on continuously on a low setting than to have short bursts of high heat.

If we think that you might benefit from more specialist advice, we can refer you to our own Tenancy Sustainment Team or Citizens Advice and others.



### What we need in our recycling

When placing recycling into your recycling wheeled bins or sacks for collection, please ensure they are clean, dry and loose - please don't put

smaller items inside larger ones e.g. cans or bottles into a cereal box.

#### Tins and cans

Drinks cans, food tins, pet food tins, sweet and biscuit tins – just give them a quick rinse. Leave lids attached or place within the emptied containers. No dirty cans or paint tins please.

We collect steel and aluminium tins and cans, which we recycle into new tins and cans!

#### Aerosols

Empty aerosols such as cans and air freshener sprays can be included in your recycling. Please don't add camping canisters or any aerosols with a hazard symbol (orange and black skull and crossbones) e.g. oven cleaner. Please don't pierce or squash aerosols.

#### Papers, magazines and cardboard

We want all different types of paper and cardboard. Newspapers, magazines, junk mail and cardboard packaging such as cereal boxes or similar. Larger cardboard boxes will need to be flattened Please don't add shredded paper, gift wrap, wet/soiled paper, tissue, paper towels, photographs and take away boxes.

#### Plastic bottles

If it is made of plastic and shaped like a bottle we want it. Drinks bottles, milk bottles, shampoo bottles. Lids and labels can be left on. Please empty any liquid and contents and squash the bottle before replacing the lid. There are plenty of other ways to recycle things, but only the items above belong in your kerbside or recycling bin or bag. Recycling banks or collections accept all sorts of material, and you can take lots of items to Household Waste Recycling Centres
