

It is essential that every home has a gas safety certificate so when you receive details of your gas servicing appointment please work with us to allow the engineer access to your home. Winter Support for families and individuals 2021/2022

Through Hampshire County Council, The Connect4communities programme manages a range of initiatives which aim to ensure that vulnerable individuals and families with children do not go without basic necessities such as food, fuel and warmth.

From November 2021 to March 2022 Winchester City Council will be supporting vulnerable households with exceptional housing costs, where existing housing support schemes do not meet need and for cases of genuine emergency.

The fund cannot be used for ongoing support for rent or mortgage payments. Eligibility for Discretional Housing Payments (DHPs) must be considered first and consideration given to whether there is a statutory risk of homelessness and therefore a duty of support is owed through the Homelessness Prevention Grant (HPG).

Tackling fly tipping

Fly tipping isn't just an eye-sore, it damages our environment and poses a threat to humans and wildlife. It's why we work hard to tackle the issue, and why culprits can face fines of up to £50,000 and a possible prison sentence. One individual who thought he could illegally dump a pile of building rubble at Hill Farm in Durley last year, has recently been handed a £1000 fine.

If you see a fly tip please <u>report it</u> and remember if you need to dispose of large items of furniture you can take them to your Local Household Waste Recycling centre free of charge or book a bulky waste collection on 01962 670 706.



Raising Fire Concerns

You can now report Fire safety concerns through <u>My Council Services</u> you don't need an account you can report concerns using the guest option at the bottom left.

The online tool can be used by a tenant, leaseholder, sublet tenant of a council leaseholder, tenant of a private landlord to report concerns they may have about the council's approach to fire safety management.

Fire safety concerns are when existing fire safety measures/features are working/present as expected but there are concerns regarding the standard applied, specification, materials used or lack of provision, approach taken.

Faults and repairs to existing systems should be reported through the usual repairs channel.
