YOUR COMMENTS ON THE CASE

I object to planning permission being granted for the works identified in the notice. As a neighbour i have suffered from substantial noise and vibration from early in the morning, to late at night and weekends. the vibrations are heard in the house and the properties are old and are not built to withstand industrial activities. it has affected my mental health as it's very intrusive and loud and the area is rural and the land is surrounded by country properties. The business is adding to further an already busy and overused site with even more HGV's. There.s already a lot of noise from lockhams and now its intolerable. I'm concerned that the nearby pond is suffering from pollution. I have not seen any appraisals relating to the habitat requirements of a pond being 200 metres away from an industrial activities. The area lends itself to encouraging all forms of wildlife with the ancient woodland which historically has badger setts and protected bats along with many animals including owls. I wonder how the polluted water is disposed of from the site. I believe the LPA requirements are sufficient to remedy the breach. I believe the time limit set by the council is more than fair considering the damage it is causing the environment and living conditions of local residents
