Winchester Churches Nightshelter	£16,000	£16,000	Our Mission is to help as many people as possible into successful independent living Our Vision is to enable people to escape homelessness. We are open 365 days a year offering accommodation, food and vital support services to those experiencing homelessness in Hampshire. We have 17 beds on site, and now have 8 more beds off site so we house 25 people every night. Last year we housed 108 people and half were Winchester referrals. We are unique in Winchester in the one-to-one support we provide on almost a 24/7 basis, working with residents to address the problems caused by, and contributing to, homelessness. Residents can stay on site every day if attending support meetings or training and remain on site all day on Sundays when other agencies are closed. We help residents find the most appropriate move-on accommodation to suit their needs and equip them with vital life skills, enabling them to move-on from homelessness for good. We work hard to prevent loss of any tenancies by trying to maintain contact, and offering regular support to those needing it after they have left us. We believe in being honest and open, treating everyone with kindness and respect, without prejudice or discrimination; and importantly we provide a safe home where residents can be comfortable and can find the help and restoration of self-esteem they need whilst at the same time fostering collaboration to work as a team with residents, staff, volunteers, the local community and other partner agencies. Trinity Winchester	£70,000	£70,000	Trinity is the only open-access day centre for homeless and vulnerable people in Winchester District. Founded in 1986 and for the last 10 years operating from a purposebuilt centre in the heart of the city, Trinity works with over 600 individuals each year. The people we support include rough sleepers, sofa surfers, vulnerable people and victims of domestic abuse. We seek to prevent homelessness as well as to help people to get their lives back on track. Trinity offers a safe, warm place to stay during the day, hot meals, washing and laundry facilities. We work with a range of partners including Winchester City Council's Housing teams and Citizen's Advice. Trinity provides physical and mental healthcare on site, delivered through St Clements NHS Surgery. We also offer dentistry and optometry to people who would be unable to register themselves due to the lack of a home address. We have our own trained, dual-diagnosis counsellors who offer group and one-to-one counselling and other wellbeing interventions. Trinity's Learning Programme offers access to accredited training, structured volunteering and job clubs. Trinity's specialist Women's Services are led by women in a discrete area of the building away from the main drop-in centre and offer the nationally recognised Freedom Programme for women escaping domestic abuse as well as a confidence-building empowerment programme and other activities to combat social isolation.
