Alleged Breach	Without planning permission, the unauthorised erection of two gates by the addition of boards attached to two five bar metal gates situated between timber fencing either side.

I refer to the above details. An appeal has been made to the Secretary of State against an enforcement notice issued by Winchester City Council on 17.10.2022

The enforcement notice was issued for the following reasons:

It appears to the Local Planning Authority that the aforementioned breach of planning control has occurred within the last four years.

The inappropriate design, scale and extent of the adapted gates along the frontage of the site introduce an urban/suburban appearance, enclosing the site which is alien to the landscape character of this rural area and contrary to policy CP20 of the Winchester District Local Plan Part 1 and policies DM15, DM16, DM17 and DM23 of the Winchester District Local Plan Part 2 and contrary to the objectives of the Soberton and Newtown Village Design Statement.

Planning conditions would not overcome these objections and therefore, the Council does not consider that planning permission should be granted.

The enforcement notice requires the following steps to be taken:

1) Remove the boards mounted to the two five bar metal gates situated between the timber fencing either side.



TIME FOR COMPLIANCE - (i) Step 1 at paragraph 5 above: 6 months.

The appellant has appealed against the notice on the following grounds:

- a) That planning permission should be granted for what is alleged in the notice.
- b) That the breach of control alleged in the enforcement notice has not occurred as a matter of fact.
- c) That there has not been a breach of planning control.
- d) That, at the time that the enforcement notice was issued, it was too late to take enforcement action against the matters stated in the notice.
- e) The notice was not properly served on everyone with an interest in the land.
- f) The steps required to comply with the requirements of the notice are excessive, and lesser steps would overcome the objections.
- g) The time given to comply with the notice is too short.

The appeal will be determined on the basis of **written representations**. The procedure to be followed is set out in the Town and Country Planning (Enforcement) (Written Representations Procedure) (England) Regulations 2002.
