UC Universal Credit

Managed Migration to Universal Credit

Managed migration'- is the final phase of the rollout of Universal Credit,

when the DWP - in a controlled way - gradually contact those who are still claiming legacy benefits to notify them that those benefits will be ending, and inviting them to claim Universal Credit instead.

Below is the proposed Timetable for all Legacy Benefits to UC.

- During 2023/24 Tax Credit only cases
- During 2024/25 Income-Related ESA with Tax Credits, Income Support, Income Based JSA, HB only or with Tax Credits
- During 2028/29 All other Income-Related ESA

The government is pushing back the managed migration of claimants from income-related employment and support allowance (ESA) to universal credit (UC) to 2028. It was due to be completed in 2024.

So the fact that it is being delayed is good news. The downside is that many thousands more claimants will now be subject to 'natural migration' because of a change of circumstances and will lose out on the transitional protection that managed migration claimants receive

Food and Fuel Vouchers

Food and Fuel Vouchers are being funded through Winter/Spring 22/23 to support council tenants in emergency need. These are one-off support payments in the form of a voucher or card which expire 6 months after being issued. You can access these when other forms of food/financial support have been exhausted or there is difficulty in accessing alternative support. Referrals are made by your Housing Officer (Income or Tenancy), Sheltered Housing Officer or Tenancy Sustainment Officer so please contact them if you'd like to be considered for food or fuel vouchers.

Crisis Food Provision

Throughout Spring 23 we will be running a Pop-up Pantry at Winchester City Council offering crisis food provision from the charity Fareshare to council tenants. If you are in urgent need of food, please contact your <u>Income</u> or <u>Tenancy</u> Housing Officer or <u>Tenancy Sustainment Officer</u> to find out more.

New Housing Services Compensation Policy

The new compensation policy approved at Cabinet Housing Committee on 2 February 2023 will ensure that a clear and consistent approach to compensation payments is adopted across the housing service.

Councillors Welcome first New Tenants to Whitley Scheme

In December 22, Leader of the Council Cllr Tod and Deputy Leader Cllr Ferguson joined new affordable housing tenant James Redman to cut the ribbon on 12 new homes in North Whiteley.

The houses are part of the council's plan to support access to good quality affordable homes in the district that are highly energy efficient, having been built to the Association for Environment Conscious Building standard, which means they are estimated to reduce CO2 emissions by 70% compared to the UK average. Neighbourhood Services and Community Safety Satisfaction Survey

In 2022 Neighbourhood Services and Community Safety Team undertook a satisfaction survey. We want to take this opportunity to update you on some of the results and the action we are undertaking as a result of your feedback. Thanks you to everyone who completed the survey. Did you know that health and safety inspections are completed at your block.

Did you know that health and safety inspections are completed at your block of flats by Neighbourhood Services Officers?

Less than half of residents (44%) participating in the survey knew that scheduled inspections were undertaken by neighbourhood services officers. We are regularly reviewing options for updating communication opportunities with our residents. In response we have created an information poster aimed at informing residents who the lead officer for each site is and the frequency of inspections. These have now been put up at our sheltered housing schemes.

Estate improvements

Feelings of safety

We asked you how safe you feel both inside and outside your block of flats. You told us that overall you feel safe or very safe inside your block (66%) and in the grounds and car parks (72%).

53% of residents told us they had experienced anti-social behaviour (ASB) within their block and 32 % within the community, though only 38% of residents had reported the ASB they experienced.

During 2022, we ran our annual anti-social behaviour summer campaign that involved undertaking patrols and awareness raising in hot spot locations. We also held block briefs and street briefs with members of the community safety partnership including local policing teams and Hampshire and Isle of Wight Fire and Rescue Service to talk to residents about their concerns and feedback on the action we are taking to address them.


Damp & Mould and how to prevent it
