WINCHESTER STREET REACH	£10,000	£7,300	Our primary objective is to empower disadvantaged and vulnerable young people aged 11-19 (up to 25 with additional needs) to recognise and achieve their full potential. Our core work is detached youth work in Weeke, Harestock, Winnall and Stanmore. We work with young people who out in the local community in areas such as shop fronts, parks and housing estates. Our youth workers meet the young people in their own territory, building trusting relationships over time in order to offer targeted support and guidance where it is most needed. Street Reach work with young people to ensure they are included within their community, especially those young people out of education or NEET, or who may be vulnerable to exploitation. Our team can act as a trusted adult to ensure that these individuals are kept safe. We deliver a range of activities and interventions to young people using creative approaches. Our work helps to redress socioeconomic disadvantage as well as reducing isolation amongst young people. We raise awareness and provide support around mental health, and our projects help raise self-esteem, build social skills, improve community relations and support physical health. We also help young people with employment and training opportunities. We also deliver a range of popular centre-based projects including a weekly drop-in Football project, a targeted workshops series, an in-school project for young people experiencing isolation, and a much-needed rural youth club in Micheldever. 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Home-Start Winchester & Districts	£10,000	£8,000	We provide the following core services: weekly home-visits of 2-3 hours by trained Volunteers, supervised by paid staff for approximately 50 families a year; weekly Family Groups, which support over 30 families per year allowing parents to play with their children, share problems and solutions with peers and seek advice from Home-Start staff and Volunteers. Parents can attend parenting courses and our goal is to stabilise the family and help them become better able to cope with the challenges and responsibilities of their parenting. Footprints Project	£3,000	£1,800	Footprints provides volunteer led mentoring, signposting and support for people in prison returning to Dorset and Hampshire, in the community or at risk of offending. We can receive referrals from any prison and last year worked with 17 prisons. Whilst we work in Winchester prison many of those returning to the Winchester district serve sentences in Dorset prisons including Guys Marsh and Channings wood. We are therefore uniquely set up to provide support for Winchester district residents.  Our services are based on an individualised plan covering: housing, education training and employment, finance benefits and debt, mental and physical health, substance misuse and gambling, families and relationships, domestic violence, rape and sexual exploitation. This is co-produced with the person during the last few months of their prison sentence or when they are referred in the community. The person will be matched with a locally trained mentor who will work with them to prioritise their needs and help them draw up a "small-steps" approach to reaching their goals. The support will include a face-to-face or phone meeting once a week with additional phone support between meetings.
