I refer to the above details. An appeal has been made to the Secretary of State against an enforcement notice issued by Winchester City Council on 29.06.2023

The enforcement notice was issued for the following reasons:

It appears to the Local Planning Authority that the aforementioned breach of planning control occurred within the last four years.

The development is contrary to Policy CP20 of the Winchester District Local Plan Part 1 - Joint Core Strategy, and Policy DM15, DM16, and DM27 of the Winchester District Local Plan Part 2 – Development Management and Site Allocations as it is considered an incongruous feature, with an insubstantial 'adhoc' character, rather than a considered conscious design feature.

By virtue of its projection above the parapet it is visible from the public realm of Winchester High Street and the surrounding area. It is therefore not considered to conserve or enhance the Winchester City Conservation Area and its special character.

The Council does not consider that planning permission should be granted because planning conditions could not overcome these objections to the development.

The enforcement notice requires the following steps to be taken:

- i. Demolish the structure (shown in the photographs at Appendix A)
- ii. Remove any resultant waste from the Land.

TIME FOR COMPLIANCE

Three months after this notice takes effect.

The appellant has appealed against the notice on the following grounds:

- a) That planning permission should be granted for what is alleged in the notice.
- b) That the breach of control alleged in the enforcement notice has not occurred as a matter of fact.
- c) That there has not been a breach of planning control.
- d) That, at the time that the enforcement notice was issued, it was too late to take enforcement action against the matters stated in the notice.
- e) The notice was not properly served on everyone with an interest in the land.
- f) The steps required to comply with the requirements of the notice are excessive, and lesser steps would overcome the objections.
- g) The time given to comply with the notice is too short.

The appeal will be determined on the basis of **written representations**. The procedure to be followed is set out in the Town and Country Planning (Enforcement) (Written Representations Procedure) (England) Regulations 2002.
