The parcel liesclose to a Scheduled Monument, comprising the remains of an Iron Age field system, banjo enclosure and Romano-British villa 500m east of Woodham Farm (SM No. 12049). A number of features can be identified continuing outwith the Scheduled Area, and there is some potential that they continue across this land holding. Current theories also suggest that these features may include an aqueduct which would have supplied water to the Roman town of Venta Belgarum (Winchester), however this was not identified in a geophysical survey which has been previously undertaken on the site. | | Previous assesment work undertaken over this site has identified a high archaeological potential, however a geophysical survey undertaken over the area has not identified any significant remains. Planning conditions have been recommended in relation to previous planning applications at this site, to secure further archaeological recording and investigation in mitigation of new development. |

Additionally, short lengths of field boundary, and a ditched feature of possible prehistoric date, have been recorded in the north western extent of this parcel, from aerial photography. Some of these features may be associated with the Iron Age/Romano-British settlement North of Grace's Farm, 650m to the NE, which is a Scheduled Monument (SM No. 527) or may be associated with extensive Iron Age settlement remains known to the SW at the Everseley Park Recreation Ground / Kings Worthy Primary School (MWC5526).The land holding also lies to the west of an extensive Anglo-Saxon cemetery in Worthy Park (Scheduled Monument SM No. 514). | Amber | This parcel lies within an area of high archaeological potential relating to Iron Age / Roman settlement and other activity. The proximity of the Anglo-Saxon cemetery at Worthy Park may also suggest further Saxon activity within the area. Further evaluation will be required to ascertain the survival of any archaeological remains present within the site and inform appropriate mitigation strategies. |

An area of extensive Iron Age settlement and associated trackways, enclosures and a post-built multi-phase circular structure (MWC5526) have been located to the west and south-west of this parcel previously, during archaeological interventions in and around Kings Worthy Primary School and at Everseley Park recreation ground. These features and associated remains may well extend across this parcel. Shovel test-pitting has previously been carried out across this land parcel, which recorded a background scatter of finds, including burnt flints, worked flints and pottery sherds dating largely from the Bronze Age and Iron Age (MCW7519), which can be added to a number of previously recorded prehistoric finds across this area (MCW495; MCW3025). No discrete distribution patterns were identified during the test-pitting, but it is likely that these finds could relate to in situ archaeological features, which were not identified due to the limited nature of this archaeological intervention. | Amber | This parcel lies within an area of high archaeological potential relating to Iron Age / Roman settlement and other activity. Further evaluation will be required to ascertain the survival of any archaeological remains present within the site and inform appropriate mitigation strategies. |

Activity on the site spans a considerable period, with isolated Palaeolithic, Neolithic and Bronze Age finds recorded in the vicinity (MWC2899; MWC6032; MWC2904 inter alia). The site appears to have been most intensely used in the Bronze Age and Romano-British periods, with extensive field systems (MWC6047), an Early Bronze Age ring ditch (MWC6052), 'Banjo' enclosures dating from 400-100 BC (MWC2923), and the Roman Villa (MWC2911) recorded across this site, dating to this period. A number of features can be identified continuing outwith the Scheduled Area, including elements of the field system which have been recorded on aerial photogoraphs to both the south and north of the scheduled area. | Red/Amber | This site has major archaeological issues and the majority of the northern field of Land Holding No. 500 comprises a <u>Scheduled Monument</u> . The archaeological remains designated as a Scheduled Monument are considered to have high significance and evidential values and are considered to form an overriding constraint to any development. The site has potential for archaeological enhancement and conservation; such as removing the land from cultivation. |
| | | | | | | Previous archaeological assessement and evaluation surveys have been conducted over the entire land parcel (comprising desk-top study, aerial photographic assessment and over the southern area - field walking and trial trenching). | | The southern field of Land Holding No. 500 is known to contain buried archaeological remains, as identified by previous archaeological investigations. However the density and significance of these remains is less than those designated as a Scheduled Monument to the north. Appropriate further mitigation measures (conservation through design or archaeological investigation and recording) could be secured via conditions. The setting of the Scheduled Monument would need to be carefully considered, however its setting is already in part, that of housing. |

A number of ditches (possibly trackways?), pits and several cremation burials within an enclosing ditch were recorded. Further archaeological assessment will be required to assess the significance and value of any such remains and the development constraint they may comprise.
