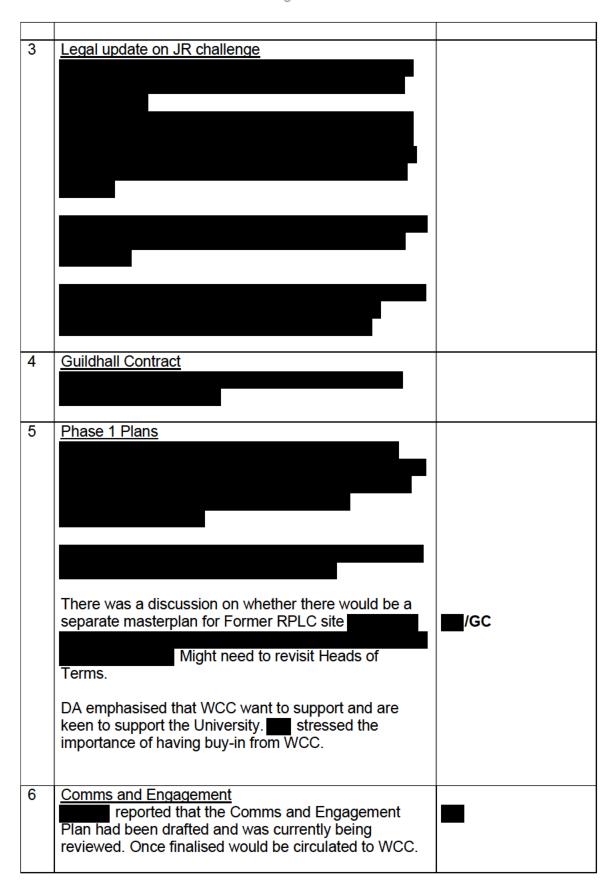

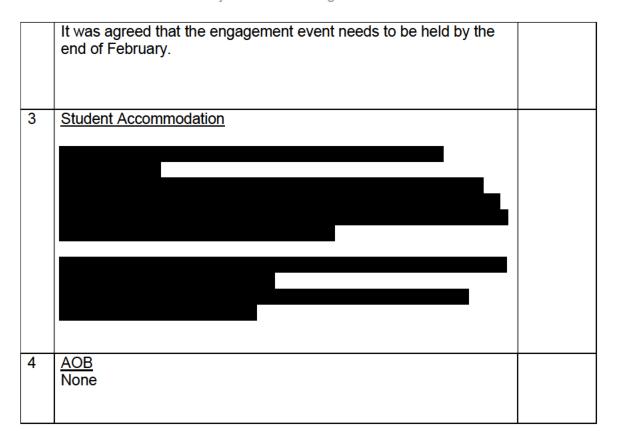

1	Welcome and Introductions  DA welcomed everyone to the meeting and introductions made	
2	UoS walk through of engagement material  UoS had circulated draft boards for public engagement session prior to the meeting.  advised that they had taken the brief from the council to bring the community on the journey. The boards explain that the UoS have been in Winchester for a long time - over 150 years, that they is a need to improve the campus and also highlights that the university already do a lot in the city.  explained that there is a lot to fix across the campus and this needs to be priority.  advised that working together with the council and the community is very important and they are supporting a lot of activities. Just signed a MOU with playhouse to provide probono Winchester poetry weekends. Need to demonstrate what we can	
	do when working in partnership.	

Date and timings to be agreed but probably evening and weekend to capture working people as well as on-line. They will send an invite to 250 households near campus as well as an advert in the Chronicle.  ET asked how people could feedback their comments.  stated there would be an email address and form on the day.		
PF stated after reviewing the Boards they seemed to focus on the existing campus whilst the community were interested in what was happening with the derelict former Riverpark Leisure Centre.		
MT referred back to commitments that were made by the UoS regarding engaging with the community. We understand that the UoS needs to undertake works to existing campus but needs to ask community their views on the whole existing and potential. MT explained the model that the council had used for Station Approach where views were gathered on what people liked in the area and what needed improving. People put post it notes on a map of the area. UoS also need to add in a timeline and show at what points they will engage with stakeholders. ET said she would share the journey timeline the council had used for SA.	ET	
MT and PF stressed the importance of the connectivity with the park but emphasising that the UoS were not building on the park.		
ES advised that there was a board missing for the former river park leisure centre. Currently there is a disconnect and she is very worried if this is not addressed. ES asked if the UoS intended to do a walkabout.  said they weren't as there was nothing to show as when you were at the campus you were there.		
suggested that as the boundary is such a hot topic a walkabout could be used to show what is in and out. To show people you are not building on the park.		
There is a park plan that had consultation - DA to provide to	DA	
DA stated that we know these projects take time and that is why we have given 5 years to see if UoS can bring forward a project.		
stated that the UoS had not placed emphasis that their proposal did not reach outside the red line agreed and that is something they can address.		
advised that their intention was to have dedicated comms advice to support and the internal team.
