Young carers are children and young people who care for a parent or sibling with a long-term illness or disability. We provide support for parents through free 1:1 consultations, Parent Support Groups and Parent Workshops. We also offer training to professionals in outdoor therapies to promote the use of nature in mental health and youth services. Home-Start Winchester & Districts	£3,726	We are one of over 180 local Home-Start schemes within the national Home-Start Federation. We help families with at least one child under five years old rebuild their lives following a crisis, a critical moment, trauma, or abuse. Our families are from diverse backgrounds, but all are navigating their most challenging times resulting from, for example, poor housing, low parental income, the stress of being a single parent, and physical or mental illness. We offer families the free emotional and practical support and friendship of fully trained and supervised volunteers who are carefully matched with them. Support is one-to-one in the home. Our aim is to improve self-esteem, resilience, and overall well-being. Additionally, we run five supportive family groups, including one in Winnall and one at the Carroll Centre in Stanmore. Footprints Project	£1,500	Footprints provides volunteer led mentoring, signposting and support for people in prison returning to Hampshire, in the community or at risk of offending. Our services are based on an individualised plan covering: housing, education training and employment, finance benefits and debt, mental and physical health, substance misuse and gambling, families and relationships, domestic violence, rape and sexual exploitation. This is co-produced with the person during the last few months of their prison sentence or when they are referred in the community. The person will be matched with a locally trained mentor who will work with them to prioritise their needs and help them draw up a "small-steps" approach to reaching their goals. The support will include a face-to-face or phone meeting once a week with additional phone support between meetings. We also work with High Risk of Harm offenders residents at The Grange in Waterlooville where we offer mental health drop-ins, healthy eating classes and NVQ Level 2 Food Hygiene training.
