



NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION AND COMING INTO FORCE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDERS

WINCHESTER CITY COUNCIL

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990 SECTION 257 & SCHEDULE 14 – PARAGRAPH 7

The Winchester City (Parish of Newlands) (Part of Footpath 731 (South) Newlands) Public Path Diversion Order 2025

The Winchester City (Parish of Newlands) (Part of Footpath 732 (West) Newlands) Public Path Diversion Order 2025

On 30th March 2026 Winchester City Council confirmed the above two Orders and, in accordance with Articles 2 and 3 of the Orders, certified that there has been created to the reasonable satisfaction of the City Council alternative sections of highway for use as replacements for the said parts of the footpaths. Therefore, the diversions of the footpaths took effect on 30th March 2026.

The effect of the Orders as confirmed are:

1. The Winchester City (Parish of Newlands) (Part of Footpath 731 (South) Newlands) Public Path Diversion Order 2025

To divert a section of public Footpath 731 (South) Newlands running from point A on path Newlands 731 to point B at the junction with paths Newlands 741 and Newlands 732 and create a new section of footpath running from point AA at the remaining northern part of Newlands 731 to BB on path Newlands 732, as shown on the Order Map reference GTWVILLE_PROW/LG/08 Rev.C.

2. The Winchester City (Parish of Newlands) (Part of Footpath 732 (West) Newlands) Public Path Diversion Order 2025

To divert a section of public Footpath 732 (West) Newlands running from point A to C and create a new section of footpath running from point A to D, as shown on the Order Map reference GTWVILLE_PROW/LG/21 Rev. B.

If any person aggrieved by the Orders desires to question their validity or that of any provision contained within them on the ground that they are not within the powers of the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made under it has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Orders, he or she may apply to the High Court for any of these purposes under section 287 of the Town & Country Planning Act 1990 within 6 weeks from the date on which this notice is published as required by paragraph 7 of Schedule 14 to that Act.
